Field Trips

Wednesday 6th June

There will be four field trips focussing on the conference theme of growing forest values. The field trips will cover Hardwood Plantations, Native Forests, Processing Industry and Conservation. Please indicate your preference on the Registration Form. The cost is included with full registrations. Cost for partners and day registrants is \$60.00, subject to seat availability.



Hardwood Plantations: This field trip will look at establishment, investment strategies, and silvicultural management of plantations in the Coffs Harbour and Grafton areas. There will be an inspection of a nursery with a focus on tree breeding and clonal developments.

Native Forests: Tour will visit State forests near Coffs Harbour with an emphasis on silviculture, ecology, planning, regulation and markets. The tour will also include hardwood plantation second rotation sites and some older plantations where changing demographics will be a topic.

Processing Industry: The Grafton region has a diverse forest industry and this tour will visit the facilities manufacturing plywood and specialty flooring and a hardwood processor who is using revolutionary seasoning practices. There will also be a visit to a special pole plant.

Conservation: The tour will include World Heritage rainforest in the Dorrigo area, the rainforest centre and a walk with the birds boardwalk and a skywalk. Old growth forest of The Norman Jolly Memorial Grove is on the itinerary. The tour will also pass through recent additions to the reserve system including the former Pine Creek State Forest which has a long association with forest management.
